# Making your way to Brighton

Grand Parade campus is in central Brighton.

Moulsecoomb campus is 2km, and Falmer is 7km from the centre of town.

## By train

- From London Victoria: Southern trains run to Brighton throughout the day. Journey times range from 50–90 minutes.
- From London Bridge: First Capital Connect trains start in Hertfordshire and pass through the city of London and down to Brighton.
- From east and west: Southern trains run along the south coast and link Brighton with Hove, Worthing and Portsmouth to the west and Lewes, Eastbourne and Hastings to the east.

## By coach

- National Express coaches depart for Brighton from London Victoria coach station 18 times a day.

## By plane

- Gatwick international airport is 30 minutes by road and rail from Brighton. The M23/A23 connects Gatwick to Brighton and the London–Brighton rail link passes through the airport which has its own station.
- Heathrow international airport is on the M25 which connects with the M23 at junction 7. There is a direct coach link to Gatwick or you can take the underground from Heathrow to London Victoria.

## By car

- From London: the M25/M23 link provides road access from London and the rest of the country.
- From east and west: the A27 and the A259 provide access to Brighton. The A259 runs along Brighton seafront.

### For Moulsecoomb, Grand Parade and Varley Halls

from the A27 eastbound take the slip road towards Hollingbury, go straight over the roundabout then down Coldean Lane. There are signs to the University of Brighton at the bottom of Coldean Lane.

**For Falmer** stay on the A27 eastbound until you see the signs to the University of Brighton.

**From the west** there are signs to the University of Brighton before and after Falmer bridge on the A270.

## Getting around Brighton

Both Moulsecoomb and Falmer sites are accessible by cycle lane, have their own local railway stations and are well-served by regular bus services.

**Moulsecoomb buses:** 24, 25, 25A, 28, 49 and 49a.

**Falmer buses:** 25, 25A and 25C.

Grand Parade is based in central Brighton so at the heart of the bus network and easily reached on foot and by bike.

# Making your way to Eastbourne

## By train

- From London: trains leave London Victoria regularly and take approximately 90 minutes to reach Eastbourne.
- From Brighton and the east and west: Southern trains connect Eastbourne with Lewes and Brighton to the west and Hastings and Rye to the east.

## By coach

- National Express coaches depart for Eastbourne from London Victoria coach station three times a day.

## By plane

- Gatwick international airport is approximately an hour from Eastbourne by road or rail. The M23/A27 route connects Gatwick to Eastbourne.
- Heathrow international airport is on the M25 which connects with the A22 at junction 6. Or you can take the underground (Piccadilly line) to London Victoria and catch a train to Eastbourne.

## By car

- From London: Eastbourne can be reached by road via the M25, A22 and then the A2270.
- From Brighton and the east (A259): Visitors travelling east on the A259 should turn right on to Warren Hill/Beachy Head Road (sign posted) for main sites which are individually signed at the Carlisle Road/Darley Road crossroads. Those travelling to Leaf Hospital should go straight on and turn right on to Upperton Road towards the town centre. If travelling on the A27 then use the A2270 (old A22) into Eastbourne.

Road signs to the university commence on the large (Willingdon) roundabout. These will take you into the town centre via Upperton Road.

**If visiting Leaf Hospital** you will be directed left at traffic lights close to Eastbourne station.

- From west (A259/A27): Visitors travelling west on the A259 should ignore A22 Eastbourne town centre signs and continue on to the large roundabout at the end of the Polegate by-pass then take the A2270.

**For university sites it is best to travel into Eastbourne via the A2270 and not the Polegate bypass.**

**If visiting Hillbrow/Welkin or Darley Road sites** you will be directed right on a mini roundabout by Eastbourne station, along Grove Road and on to Meads Road, then Beachy Head Road.

**If you require the Hillbrow/Welkin site**, turn right off Meads Road up Carlisle Road (sign posted). For the Darley Road site, continue on the Meads Road and on to Beachy Head Road (straight on at two mini roundabouts) and then left into Darley Road (sign posted).

## Getting around Eastbourne

Eastbourne town centre and the seafront are both within walking and cycling distance of the university. You can catch the number 3 and 4 buses from the Terminus Road bus stop outside Eastbourne train station to Darley Road and Hillbrow/Welkin sites.

# Making your way to Hastings

## By train

- From London: trains leave London Victoria regularly and take approximately 2 hours.
- Trains from London Charing Cross stop at Hastings and take approximately 1 hour and 40 minutes
- From Brighton: Southern trains to Hastings take approximately one hour. You can reach Hastings from the east via Ashford International Station.

## By coach

- National express coaches depart for Hastings from London Victoria Coach Station journey time is approximately 3 hours.

## By plane

- Gatwick international airport is approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes from Hastings by road or rail. The M23/M25 connects with the A21 or the London Victoria train from Hastings stops at Gatwick airport.
- Heathrow international airport is on the M25 and connects with the A21. Or you can take the underground from Heathrow and catch the train to Hastings from either London Charing Cross or London Victoria.

## By car

The University Centre Hastings can be reached by road via the M25, A21 and A259.

## Getting around Hastings

University Centre Hastings is in walking distance from both the train station and town centre (approx 5 minutes). Hastings has bus services within the local area.
